stressed, and panicking about shortage of food during this covid-19 pandemic. Even in this situation, my family is managing to eat healthy nutritious food daily. "We never slept on an empty stomach". We never lived on imported food items or easy take away food. We have our own organic garden; we looked after our native self-growing plants in our environment. We have plenty of native vegetables such as, papaw mango, native brinjal, lotus roots, murunga, and many more green leaves which are high in food value and save our income. Anyone who practices to preserve and promote native plants will nerve go hungry.

I will share my family healthy staple breakfast recipe with all ingredients from my garden. Scraped green papaw, scraped coconut, add turmeric, onions, green chilies Murunga leaves and stir-fry in coconut oil. Total cost is Rupees 25. Our cooperative woman farmers learnt many native nutritious cooking from the community cooking demonstration of (SUVI AVAI) TASTE FORUM by KKM.

Covid-19 has made a positive impact on all us. STOP AND THINK of all the precious gifts our native mother has provided for our survival.



The year 2020 has been a very difficult year for all of us struggling with the restrictions of Covid 19 but. it has given me time to reflect on the origins and achievements of KKM over a period of over 20 years.

Kaveri Kala Manram (KKM) was founded 22 years ago in 1998 in the village of Kattupulam near Chuillipuram in a camp for internally displaced people (IDPs) with mainly leprosy affected families. The initial efforts of KKM was to provide immediate relief and medical assistance to these people living in harsh conditions. In 2002 it became possible to house some of these children in two Homes named after myself and my late husband, which was cofounded with the invaluable assistance of my cofounders Dr Preman and Rev Joshua

Over the years it has become possible to resettle these people back in their own areas securing homes and sustainable

Livelihoods. KKM's activities now encompass not only the Northern Province but more recently also the Eastern Province. A summary of tasks and achievements are listed in this Newsletter. In particular KKM is working in the area of Batticaloa with local organizations and government agencies to support people affected by leprosy. A disease which presents many challenges in this area. This is possible as KKM has a strong partnership with the Leprosy Mission of England and Wales through the work of Rev Joshua. Under their guidance and support KKM is embarking on the next five years with renewed vision.

In addition to this work KKM has a commitment to work towards the global strategy of Triple Zeros:

Zero Transmission Stopping leprosy

Zero Transmission Disabilities preventing girls and boys from being disabled by leprosy Zero Discrimination Abolishing discriminatory laws and practices

KKM also supports a number of young people from low income families in education. Assistance may be given at primary level extending in some cases through to university. Students come from families often suffering sickness or bereavement who are unable to provide funds for books etc. In furthering their education many students have been able to achieve employment in the area to benefit themselves and the community.

I am proud of the achievements and dedication of the Rev Joshua and the staff at KKM. I think much has been achieved over a period of 20 years and I am confident that with your support our work at KKM will continue to benefit and improve the lives of many people.

Even this Pandemic situation Thirvalvar Pre School & Kalaivane Pre Schools teachers working among children & parents with proper pre planed practice . As you may be awre, since resettlement in 2010, our biggest concern has been the protection of children's mental and physical development. Pregnant women and young children were greatly affected by the war and the majority of current preschool age children were born during this time. Jeyaratnam family decided to support this concern and built a nursery school in in Malayalapuram, Killinochi. They have also provided continuous help to the project. In the latter part of 2010 we started Thiruvaluvar Preschool and from 2010 to 2020 nearly 470 children have gone through basic education at this school. The Education Department recognized our work and saw the need to provide education for older children of six years and above.



They have since built this school. As the parents, children and teachers of Thiruvaluvar Pre-School, we give our special thanks to Dr Preman and his entire family for their generous contributions

and dedication to working with war affected children. Ages 3-5 are the most in important in a human's life for their physical and mental development. Never before have we had this kind of opportunity but now we have the environment, management and training to give the next generation a great start in life.



In General people live with mechanical thoughts, influenced by the society, the culture and tradition etc. However, human mind looks for ingenuity. We are promptly attracted towards

people who think differently and act genuinely. Indeed, our mind draws towards them so as to gain something good from them.

I am attracted to a genuine thinker for the last 12 years. Since then, my attraction towards him never decreased rather it got increased. He is none other than Rev. Joshua, I met him 12 years ago in Kandy in a Playback Theatre workshop. He appeared to be a talented stage performer. Later I found him to be a social activist.

Once again I met him in his Centre-Kavari Kala Mandram -KKM which is located in Killinochchi in the year 2016. I came to know that through his Centre-KKM he has begun to conduct social awareness programs in the Northern Province through street drama and folk drama. Indeed, the government departments also had been approaching him, requesting him to perform dramas in rural villages to create awareness on various issues such as dengue prevention and so on.

According to my knowledge, KKM is the only prominent organization that works for Leprosy prevention and rehabilitation. Unlike any other ordinary non-governmental organization, KKM does not have the intention of generating money. Unless the donor's intention falls in the perspective of KKM, they refuse to receive any financial aid from any donor agency. Self-respect is very much preserved and in the same way it is inculcated among the beneficiaries of the organization.

KKM has a vision to make people self-reliable. They train people to be satisfied with what they have and to look forward to gain what is necessary for their survival in the long run. During the early stage of Covid-19 spread in Sri Lanka, NGOs were looking for donor agencies to get funds so as to get involved in relief work for the affected. However, KKM refused to receive funds. Rather they motivated people to utilize their home gardens to generate income.

Apart from all the involvements in making people aware about certain issues of the country, they are also keen on introducing traditional food practices to the people of the area. The purpose of this venture is to make use the local food items in daily meals while spending a little money to consume nutritious diet.

I wish that the KKM may continue their good work in the same spirit so as to uplift people and to strengthen them to stand by on their own feet.

I was aware that my father had Leprosy but I was too young to realize the gravity of the nature of the illness. My father took treatment from the hospital but didn't realize that he has to take the medicine regularly and for a long period of time. My mother also got infected. Both were taking treatment from hospital. Because of the illness and the effect of medicines they were feeling week. So they stopped taking the medicines regularly. PHI and his assistant took special interest and gave advice to take the medicine regularly.

Both my parents did not take nutritious food as a result they felt week and neglected the medicine. Whenever I tried to check they did not admit about not taking medicine. Two years later my sister was diagnosed to have the infection and soon after I was diagnosed to be infected from years January 2020 both of us is taking treatment.

Now my sister and I are fully cured and back to normal. Unfortunately my parents are not.. They are left with neuritis. This is numbness of toes and fingers which has left them with deformities. Had they used the medications regularly like us they would not have developed deformities.



During our treatment KKM gave us support by regularly supervising us about the medications and also supplied food supplements. This was really a great help to us. We were pleased in having a Tube well, donated by KKM. My parents are enjoying home gardening and are very thankful to KKM.

Now I am a voluntary worker for the Northern Province. If I see any signs of leprosy in my neighbors and friends I advise them to seek medical help. I help members of the medical service to locate patients in our village.
