

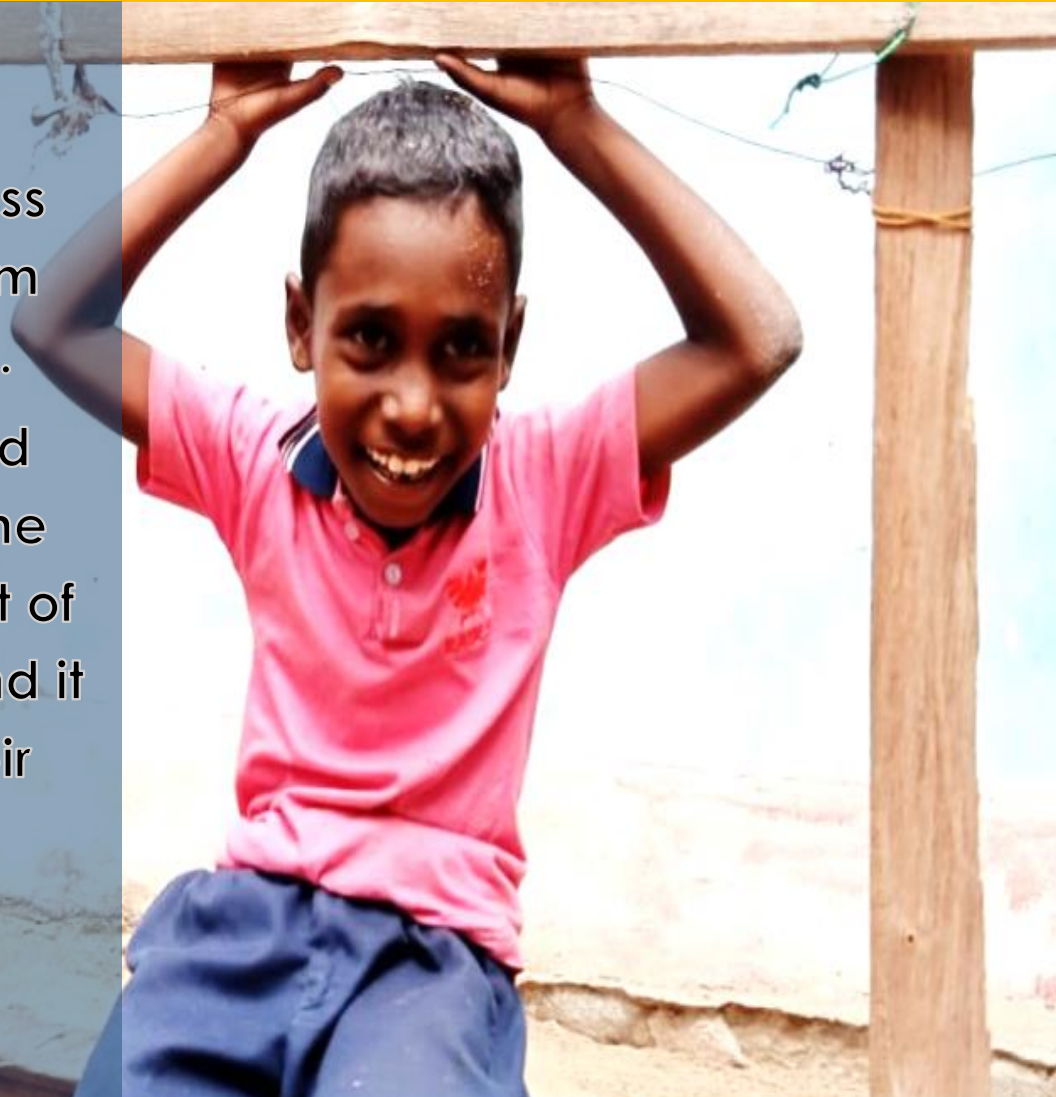

7. KKM believes that all of God's creation are equal and treats people without discrimination of caste, religion or ethnicity.

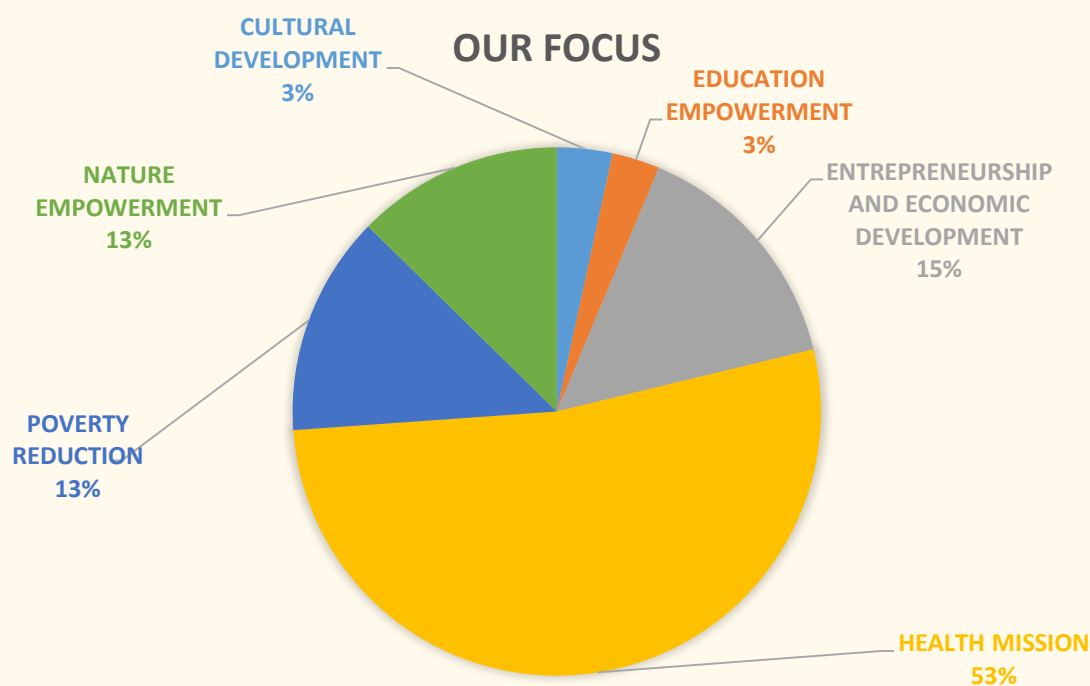

HEALTH MISSION

1. LEPROSY EARLY DETECTION WORK



OUR ACTIVITIES

- 1) Reduced transmission through improved early detection and treatment of leprosy.
- 2) Empowerment and increased self-reliance of people affected by leprosy through community-based rehabilitation
- 3) Reduced vulnerability through improved agriculture and nutrition for people affected by leprosy within Jaffna, Batticaloa, Mannar and Vavuniya Districts.

Covid 19 restrictions and challenges have not been a barrier in our project activities. With grace of God and a dedicated team support we have planned 402 activities under the three outcomes. With God's guidance we have completed 621 programs since January to Dec 2021 (06 months). These achievements have happened midst of COVID 19 challenges. Totally 5909 people in communities received knowledge of leprosy and to increase detection leprosy case & reduce stigma in North, North Central & Eastern province.

Specially 351 people affected by leprosy are getting benefits through these 12 months in all our activities. 62 New cases detected over this year with 05 child cases in project area with limited public awareness programs by this Pandemic lockdown.



These 05 child has been detected through 3 School screening with leprosy awareness programs. These child cases were detected in Batticaloa districts &

Anurathapuram districts during this reporting period. More child cases were detected in Batticaloa a district as a first experience for them through our leprosy awareness programs .42 Cases were detected through a strong contact survey program in Anurathapuram & Batticaloa districts from 62 new cases. 12 People affected by leprosy families with 84 members of family received water & sanitation facilities under this project. Most of the people affected by leprosy families were sharing water facilities with their neighbors. This water sharing opportunity is creating social inclusion & reducing social stigma in the community.

EYE OPENER



Kumarasingam living in Chankani village Jaffna - working as a welfare and drug and alcohol awareness officer for the Northern

Province. 'KKM' team conducted a Leprosy awareness program for the community in the community hall. As a Northern welfare officer I was lucky to be there. The awareness program was an eye opener for many. I witnessed few drug and alcohol addicts coming forward to be checked for symptoms. They were all directed to Jaffna



hospital for proper checkup. On behalf of the Northern Province welfare, drug and alcohol centers, I thank KKM and TLMEW for their good community work.

I BUILT UP STRENGTH AND COURAGE



Linusha living in Koduvamadu Batticaloa with my mother, my brother and sister. We are all schooling in Koduvamadu. My father deserted us leaving us in a difficult situation. My mother sells fire wood to the community which was the only income for daily living. As usual daily after school, I visited my friend for a chat and play with her, when

the PHI and staff of KKM were visiting them. They noticed a white patch on my cheeks, straight away directed me for a medical check-up and I was diagnosed of leprosy. Which shocked and scared our family, not knowing a full awareness of the disease.

I was lucky to have KKM team and the PHI to give me moral support, counselling, reassuring and encouraging me to continue the medication and schooling. I loved when one of the staff, like my elder sister shared her courage story when she was diagnosed of leprosy. Listening to her experiences, I built up strength and courage. I continued my medication and I am back in school. KKM provided us with a water well and motivated us to do home gardening. We have a garden of our own which produce fresh vegetables and fruits. Today we are a happy family because of all the loving and caring support given to us by KKM team and TLMEW.



A LITTLE LIGHT TO SHINE THE WAY



I am **Yogeswary Sivarasa** living in Katupulam Jaffna with my family and three children. My husband is a daily labor worker. We were struggling to live day to day without a stable income and the

basic facilities. We have to walk ½ kilo meter to get our water. During the rainy season the well get flooded with muddy water which caused infectious diseases and facing challenges after challenges throughout our life. During these difficult times in 2016 my husband and my son were diagnosed with leprosy. We were lost to this world.

KKM staff visited my family giving us the strength and support to move on with our life. They built tube well, gifted 20 coconut seedlings and vegetable plants and encouraged us to do home gardening. This was the greatest gift and a blessing in our life for healthy living. To day 10 of the coconut trees are producing enough coconuts for our income. Selling a coconut for 50 Rupees,



and seasonal vegetables, I am able to get 2000 rupees' monthly income. I am proud to say I am supporting my kid's education, eating healthy fresh food daily and living a happy life.

At present in this covid pandemic I am still continuing my business in the neighborhood and to local shops. I daily thanks to God for all blessings given to my family by AED and KKM team, giving us a sustainable life and caring support. [Watch a video](#)

2. LEPROSY ASSOCIATION

WHY WE ARE ?

A diagnosis of leprosy in a family can mean the loss of work, divorce or the end of marriage prospects, even for distant relatives. Therefore, those labeled as “having leprosy” are often sent away and denied a family role, in case the whole family is negatively affected. The entire (village) community considers that leprosy-affected people are a burden. Thus, leprosy stigma determines attitudes and actions that affect

OUR GOAL ...

The goal is: Development of the People’s Forum for Change into an effective leprosy people’s organization supporting, empowering, and advocating for the rights of people affected by leprosy.

OUR OBJECTIVES.

Strengthened capacity of The People’s Forum for Change and the leprosy affected people who constitute its members.

Societal inclusion through addressing all forms of discrimination and stigma.

People’s forum for change dedicate to eradicate leprosy stigma and discrimination in Sri Lanka

Stigma is a social process characterized by labeling, stereotyping, exclusion, rejection, fear, blame, devaluation and dismissal. Stigma in leprosy results in denial of equity, social justice and human rights. It is one of the major barriers to early case finding and treatment, often resulting in social and economic dislocation. Women and children are threatened even more by stigma and discrimination necessitating a special focus on their situation.

Overcoming and eliminating stigma as individuals and as a society is a critical step to full integration and participation of persons affected by leprosy and their family members into the mainstream of the community. It is important for both the person affected by leprosy and the community to have positive examples and to create a new frame of reference that replaces outdated beliefs and traditions.

People’s forum for change work with persons affected by leprosy, to identify and change negative attitude beliefs and practices that are negative

Individuals and institutions responsible for health promotion should acknowledge the expertise and critical role of persons affected by leprosy and invite them to be part of the consultative group for planning the process. This involves elaborating a common goal, developing a mutual understanding of roles and responsibilities, and identifying the skills necessary for fulfilling the roles. It is also important

whole communities, not just the individual. It therefore breaks down the dignity, confidence and economic wellbeing of thousands in Sri Lanka , by damaging the aspirations and opportunities of those directly and indirectly affected by the disease.



that the media and community are held accountable for referring to the person affected by leprosy in a sensitive and dignified way.

People’s forum for change Provides opportunities to share experiences, develop new attitudes and acquire new skills

Some persons affected by leprosy may develop negative attitudes about themselves resulting in self-isolation. One way to address this is to organize empowerment workshops, which provide an opportunity for sharing successes and challenges, developing new perspectives and fostering an understanding of each person’s potential and usefulness to society. A successful example is the Guidelines for strengthening participation of persons affected by leprosy in leprosy services

socio-economic empowerment workshops conducted by various organizations including those led by persons affected by leprosy. Providing opportunities for individuals affected by leprosy to work in leprosy services can empower



people and further increase self-esteem. Similarly, providing opportunities for such persons to improve their economic situation through income generation programmes, helps to promote social identity within the individual’s family and society and improves self-worth. This is especially important for women. Persons who have successfully redefined themselves socially can become role models for others.

GOD SEND RIGHT PEOPLE AT RIGHT TIME



I was walking down the street, lost in my thoughts. Suddenly I came across a strange man with a friendly approach, who wanted to know about the discolored patches on my face. I ignored him in anger for his behavior for stopping a lady and asking silly questions. On the following day this strange man visited me with the local PHI, made me nervous and anxious.

I have had thickened discolored skin on my face which never bothered me. When PHI explained his visit, tested me and I was identified as a leprosy patient. I have two children and I was pregnant with my third baby. When I found out that my two kids have been infected with leprosy, I was helpless, depressed, lost self-esteem and thinking the world has come to an end for my family. My nightmare of imagining the baby in my womb, praying to God for his love and guidance for a healthy leprosy free baby. I was not on treatment because of my pregnancy.

The PHI introduced Shanmugam, as a member of a group called (Thuthvan) Guardian Messenger of KKM, who shows compassion and helps people around him. No



sooner a visit from a staff member of KKM and Shanmugam, giving my family compassion, promising a bright future and pulling my family out of darkness, was God's blessing. Listening to Shanmugam's own experience of leprosy, gave me courage and hope. End of November 2021, I was blessed with a healthy baby boy like a shining star and it was an early precious Christmas gift for us.

I am grateful and value messenger Shanmugam for stepping and saving my family. I always believe that God send right people at right time for rescue. The KKM Guardian Messenger help group is committed to the empowerment of individuals, families, and communities affected by leprosy or risk of the disease. They are conducting successful awareness programmes in many other districts. My family was delighted to listen to Shanmugam's helping nature around him. Finally, Shanmugam said,

Daily to soak my feet in clean water, oiling and daily massaging to prevent dry skin and ulcer. I do my exercises and keep my feet clean with discipline. KKM have taught me to control the disease rather than the disease control me. I thank the self-care team of KKM and TLMEW for all the caring support.



WE ARE GETTING FRESH VEGETABLES AND FRUITS FROM OUR OWN GARDEN



Selvarasa living with my wife in Koduvamadu Batticaloa. We are both elderly couple living by ourselves in a temporary mud hut without any basic facilities and proper food to eat. I was a

leprosy patient, had deformity of hands with clawed fingers and abnormal function of my feet. I was accidentally noticed by the local PHI one day, knowing I was a leprosy patient, PHI contacted KKM. With the support of KKM, I was given monthly nutritious food pack which helped me to stabilize my strength. They built a tube well at our home and encouraged us to do home gardening. Under their FOOD FOR WORK project during the 2020 covid 19 we were given food packets for survival and they set up a home garden for us. We started our garden with full of interest and enthusiasm. Soon we were able to get our fresh



vegetables and fruits from our own garden. We are proud to tell all our neighbors and community that even during this present Covid situation we are well managing a happy healthy life. We thank PHI, KKM and TLMEW for all their generous support given to us.

Nature's contributions to people have been valued by people from time immemorial. Their reactions to nature had often been fear and thus worshipping it. Much like earlier times of pandemics, the world has been fighting a war against Coronavirus since November 2019. The tiny virus has changed and still changing the lifestyles of people all over the world. We are faced with a new normal in all our ways of operating and in all spheres of human living, whether it be religious practices, work and education or even something simple as food consumption. We are challenged to find new ways of being and acting, gathering and flourishing.

In the recent past, Sri Lanka has been badly affected by coronavirus, with deaths and those infected rising

drastically. Our major national income by tourism also continues to be severely affected. Prices of day-to-day needs are increased every day.

School children are forced to move from class room based education to online education. The poor children face great difficulties in coping with the system due their lack of electronic gadgets such as smart phone and laptops. Teachers fight for their salary on the streets. Farmers find it tough to sell their agricultural products. By the time the plantation tea-estate workers get their 1000/= salary, the prices go up. The politicians as usual make use of the context to politicize everything for the fulfillment of their political agenda. In this context, the Civil Society Organizations have a major role to play. We have to identify the human and natural resources in our

rural areas and support the people to utilize those resources to enhance their lives. Instead of spending our energy on the past and the future, we need to focus on our present time because our present time itself is becoming worse.

PLANTATION COMMUNITY RESEARCH SEMINAR IN THE NEW NORMAL CONTEXT

Malayaha Thamizahars' (UP country Tamils) life begins 200 hundred years ago in the Island. The history tea production begins more than 150 years ago in the country. As the people of this sector have been living in Sri Lanka for more than 2 centuries, their basic right specially the land and housing ownership is not yet fully realized. Governments and plantation politicians periodically speak about this but so far a concrete policy is not made. Plantation politician also do not touch this fundamental rights seriously. They go for building houses for the workers but the ownership is still a question mark.

Though a lot of articles, discussions, seminars take place on various issues of the plantation community, the development process is slow. For more than 200 years, the people have been utilized only as a laborer. Our economy resource is tea and rapper. This source is in the hand of private companions in turn the labor force is on our people. Furthermore, the distance between these 2 parties always become a wider.

Malayaha trade unions, civil society organizations, NGOs, literature, research, higher educations, women movements most of the time speak the past history or motivate the younger generation to follow government based education and get out of the estates which is our mother land. The workers themselves do not see their work as a dignified work though every moment millions of

people drink tea in the world. Our younger generation do not have an urge to work in the estate rather they like to work in the cities as a daily wage labor. People who think to transform the plantation do not have a concrete action plan for this venture. In this context, we all have the responsibility to make the plantation community to become economy centered community from being from mere working labor community. All the factors that make a community as a community should support this venture. To do this, we have to create a platform for young researchers who could make new proposal to make the plantation community becoming an economy centered community.

In this context Jesuit Reconciliation Solidarity Sri Lanka-JRSS, Centre for Social Concern-CSC and Kavari Kala Mandram jointly organize a research seminar in January 2022. The proposed topic is **Transforming the Plantation Community from Labor centered Community to Economic Centered Community**. The plantation community has its own resource that is tea. This resource is a outcome of our fathers and mothers who toil in the tea garden. Hence, each laborer has the privilege to have the land and economic rights-entitlement of land and tea production.

Sisara Karunaratna living in Anuradhapura, living with my parents and two sisters. My father is a daily labor worker. I was diagnosed of leprosy in 2020 and was on continuous medication. I was depressed and worried about my future and other family members getting infected. We live in little unsafe mud house. We didn't have a toilet at home. We were able to get water from our well only in rainy seasons. In summer we have to walk up to distant river for our daily use. With my father's income we were struggling for our survival. PHI of Anuradhapura district and KKM visited us one day, willing to support us to build a safe concrete house, a toilet and a tube well. Now we live in a safety home, clean toilet to use, and healthy well water. As a family we have started our home garden, we have seasonal vegetable plants and yams. On behalf of my family I thank KKM for all their generous support giving us a happy new life. Thanking all.

PARAI is an emblem of the Tamil culture. It is usually accompanied by folk dance which has a great importance in Tamil culture. The rhythm of Parai represents the universal heartbeat of Mother Earth, the universal goddess and mother to us all. People beat the Parai and dance to its rhythms. Parai is used in dramas, plays, weddings, temple festivals, cultural celebrations.



I am Kalivani from Katupulam Jaffna. From my young age, I had a passion and love for music, art and dancing which was an inborn gift and blessing. I always feel music gives a power of healing and music is more than just sound, it is an art with rhythm, tune and emotion and meanings.

I was encouraged and empowered by Joy Sabanathan to continue my musical journey teaching Parai to help the children in the village. I have formed a group of children in the village teaching them the significant and cultural values and diversity in the art of Parai. Children learn

with great enthusiasm, have regular practice and so far, the group have performed their talents in many cultural events.

The incredible reasons our children need arts and music in their lives is to help them with skills of expressing themselves, build up confidence, self-esteem, physical, mental strength and happiness. I am sure this programme will motivate and inspire the future generation of the community. I hope and pray, that I could continue my service connecting our children to their cultures and communities.

EDUCATION EMPOWERMENT

1. SCHOOL CLASSROOM DEVELOPMENT



Sri Lanka's plantation Community has a tragic history of pervasive discrimination, exploitation and violence. Originally brought from India in the 1820s to work in Sri Lanka's plantations in conditions of slavery during colonial times, the exploitation of their labor continues to this date. The postcolonial state played a primary role in perpetuating and entrenching discrimination, firstly, by the enactment of the Citizenship Act to render the majority of the 'Indian Tamils' stateless and disenfranchised. Even though the state claims that corrective measures were taken and the statelessness is now zero, the effects are intergenerational and severe. To this date, the poverty-stricken community continues to be an invisible entity, allowed to be exploited by private and State owned companies for national and private profits, with little benefits transferred to the community.



This picture shows the paradox in life. I cannot say that the children are living in a HOUSE. House has got its own definition. This is the core of poverty. This picture not only describes their poverty but also the type of social system they have. Of course they the parents of these children have the eligibility for voting. But those who are elected by their votes never sees the houses or what?

There are many factors one has to take into consideration for this condition. History, psyche of the plantation people,

discrimination of the government etc are some of the reasons for the situation. However, instead of blaming a group or a system we can think what we can do positively to transform the community for a better living.

The paradox is that in spite of the living conditions, the children are going to school and they are smiling. They are the future. They are called to have a decent life in the same environment. Civil Society Activists and teachers have a major role to play. Some of the following activities may help to transform the community:

But now transformation has been started by Mrs Jennifer & her friends through Kaveri Kala Manram. Kavery Kala Manram had requested these following proposal to them "Eheliyagoda Tamil School in Kegale district in Sri Lanka, at present



there are 89 children studying and 13 teachers in the School. Some class rooms' buildings damaged by heavy cyclone in this School & are not safe for students to study. This School was built for

children of plantation works. Plantation community workers are living under the extreme poverty situation because they couldn't help rebuild immediately. They are waiting for government help but still have not any positive response. Therefore, school community requesting with Kaveri Kala Manram"

Now new class room established within two months with help of Jennifer & her friends with parent's labor contribution.

How this transformation going to achieved, Provincial education director said.

After this class room development from damaged situation, Now Children regardless of cultural beliefs and customs enjoy learning in a classroom that gives them ample opportunities to play, feel happy, and secure. This noticeable ambience of a classroom is giving children space for easy and safe movement. Motion permits children to move freely in the

allocated spaces, creating their own boundaries, and explore their abilities by handling different objects. Class teachers now create environments that match the age and level of the children they teach. This good classroom arrangement inspires, and encourages children to easily interact with each other and develop various skills including language, and social behavior through smart board presentations.

Previous damaged classroom physical arrangement may affect children's free movement and can result into social behavior problems, they couldn't have learnt good education from those situations. Because of this Social behavior problem erupt in places that are not well managed, have no guiding rules, and have mixed objectives to achieve.

There is five class room for 89 children we have built one class room which grade 4 children are studying.

2. PRESCHOOL EDUCATION



Since resettlement in 2010, our biggest concern has been the protection of children's mental and physical development. Pregnant women and young children were greatly affected by the war and the majority of current preschool age children were born during this time. Unfortunately Sri Lanka lacked a good pre-school infrastructure especially in regards to teacher training, childcare and the development of basic skills.

After the war in the northern region ended most people focused on developing infrastructure and livelihoods, we were concerned about human development, especially babies. Dr Preman and his family decided to support this concern and built a nursery school in in Malayalapuram, Killinochi. They have also provided continuous help to with project.

In the latter part of 2010 we started Thiruvalluvar Preschool and from 2010 to 2013 nearly 300 children have gone through basic education at this school. The Education Department recognised our work and realised the need to provide education for older children from seven years and above.

WELCOMING CEREMONY

The new 2021 admission children were honored and a warm welcome was given by the previous children.



SARASWATHI POOJA CELEBRATION

Even though the school was closed during the festival the last day dedicated to Goddess Saraswathi was worshiped and celebrated in school by children thanking Mother Saraswathi for her blessing and giving them the knowledge of speech, wisdom, art, music and learning.



DRAWING COMPETITION

Annual drawing competition was held for children to share and express their dreams. Children were motivated to draw, create and share their abilities with other children in the community.



CHILDREN'S DAY

The world children's day was celebrated with fun, and joy considering children are the future of our nation. The theme was building up unity of WE ARE ONE. Children from other school were invited to take part in the event.

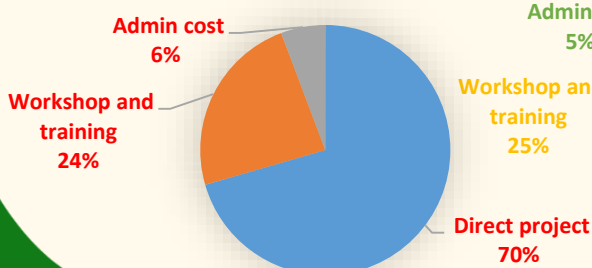

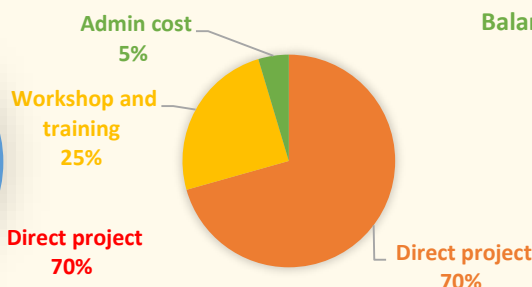

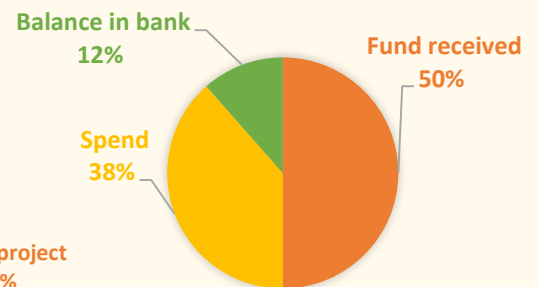
FUND RECEIVED CHART

ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Post covid 19, underutilized/neglected leafy vegetables and its value-added products to strengthen agritourist of sri lanka
Ms. R. Thusyanthini, Lecturer, Sri Lanka school of agriculture, Kilinochchi, Sri Lanka.



Maintaining a healthy, balanced diet is a key to helping immune system function properly and to improve your mood and energy levels during COVID-19. Neglected and underutilized leafy vegetables can make an important contribution to the economy, food security and nutrition requirement of Sri Lanka. Good nutrition is crucial for health, particularly during and post Covid, immune system needs to fight with the virus. In contrast, limited access to fresh foods may compromise opportunities to discontinue eating a healthy and varied diet. It potentially leads to an increased consumption of highly processed foods, which tend to be high in fats, sugars and salt.

Underutilized leafy vegetables may not be widely known outside of a specific area or region in Sri Lanka. And there is a perception that they are grown mostly in rural areas. In some places consumption of these plants is not socially acceptable by some community sectors because they are considered to be food for the poor. Underutilized leafy vegetables have local or regional importance, but generally lack of national recognition, no accessibility of information, few researches and appreciation though underutilized leafy vegetables have under-exploited potential to ensure food security, nutrition, health, income generation and environmental services.

Rev. Joshua, Director of KKM, Sri Lanka said that underutilized leafy vegetables could not be valued by Sri Lankan though which have nutritional aspects than major growing leafy vegetables. Nowadays people consume these only as medicinal purposes while very tiny percentage of Sri Lankan consume these in their

daily diet. Further who said that post Covid, will definitely make people aware to consume these underutilized leafy vegetables daily to improve their immunity. Meanwhile who mentioned that value added products of underutilized leafy vegetables would certainly improve agro tourism and export marketing then which would directly contribute for developing livelihood of Sri Lankan citizens and entire nation's economy.

Further, in 21st century many individuals often do not have the time to prepare home-cooked meals. However, at present the social distancing associated with the COVID-19 outbreak has meant that many families have been spending entire day at home, which provides new opportunities to spend the possibility to make those recipes you previously did not have time to make. Hence, this is the needy time to promote the products. In the point of national, which may create the international marketing in the direction of healthy eating. However, which needs co-operation of both agri-food and health sectors of Sri Lanka to decline existing considerable gap in the science and technology development related to strengthening the position of underutilized leafy vegetables in Sri Lanka.

According to, Rev. Joshua, Director of KKM, Sri Lanka, with his concern towards poor income families during Covid, who has been introducing various value-added underutilized leafy vegetables, such as Keerai mixture, Keerai bread, Keerai cake, Keerai Appalam, Keerai wine, keerai urukai, Keerai maravalli poriyal and Keerai sambol in Kilinochchi district Sri Lanka. Who visits households at village level and spend his time to guide people to prepare the products. With respect to that, the given table shows some of the products which have been introduced to the community in the district.



In recommendation, as it is mentioned earlier paragraph one of the main barriers to the effective integration for underutilized / neglected leafy vegetables and its' value-added products are that disconnect that exists between the agriculture, environment, health and nutrition sectors and the lack of coordination between the many actors that need to be involved. To support the process and drive the effective

mainstreaming, building capacity and establish effective research partnerships that undertake nutritional composition, and by improving awareness and understanding among the many different stakeholders, which include researchers, universities and government agencies, relevant national ministries, local governments, small-scale producers and civil society.

Even throughout the Covid period, our beneficiaries were continuously checked of their wellbeing and safety via phone calls. We have 24x7 open line for any emergency reporting. We have been keeping a monthly record of all Safeguarding concerns and taking necessary actions. Quarterly submitting our reports at the comity meetings to the members. We are proud to say that we are maintaining and managing the safety and wellbeing of the community. Updating our report half – yearly to the TLMEW Safeguarding team leader.

BRIDGING DIFFERENCES

How leprosy work is making a contribution to peace-building in Sri Lanka.

Every year over 2,000 new cases of leprosy are diagnosed in Sri Lanka. People affected by the disease live in all parts of the island nation, belong to various ethnic groups and encounter similar challenges. Kaveri Kala Manram (KKM), an organisation in the north of Sri Lanka, has been assisting and empowering people affected by leprosy for the past 20 years in partnership with The Leprosy Mission England and Wales. Under the leadership of Reverend Joshua Sivagnam, KKM endeavors to reach out with kindness to all persons affected by leprosy, irrespective of class, ethnicity or creed. Through leprosy work, it has managed to generate goodwill and embark on peace-building in a country that continues to encounter pockets of racial disharmony and religious intolerance.

LIFE-CHANGING ENCOUNTER In 2013, members of KKM encountered Amarasinghe Manjula, a gentleman who had been diagnosed with leprosy and was facing difficulties. Although he was from a different ethnic background, KKM staff offered him the same care and assistance as they would one of their own. Once recovered, Amarasinghe, appreciative of the support and kindness he had received, joined KKM to raise leprosy awareness in his village, Bohagasveva.

Many unifying goodwill gestures started to flow from this encounter. Amarasinghe invited KKM staff to his hometown, where the residents cordially welcomed them in a traditional Sinhala ceremony. The guests fondly recall the Sinhala children sang Tamil songs in a show of solidarity and comradeship. In turn, each member of KKM's staff has chosen to financially assist a school student in the village to further

strengthen this valuable inter-racial friendship. A total of 35 school children benefit from this generous support. KKM also funds nutritious food for 102 students who attend Sunday classes at a Buddhist temple. In 2017, in a further endeavor to connect the ethnic groups, Tamil families affected by leprosy from the north traveled to meet with Sinhala families further south to share their stories and develop mutual understanding. In 2018, KKM members again ventured south to celebrate the Sinhala-Tamil New Year together. An estimated 108 people participated in the celebrations. 'A TASTE OF PEACE' Dhammananda Thero, the executive director of the Walpola Rahula Institute for Buddhist studies, visited KKM's headquarters in Kilinochchi to encourage KKM's unifying work and share his own experiences of social healing initiatives in Tamil areas such as Mullaitivu on the northeast coast. To fortify peace

building in Sri Lanka, Dhammananda Thero kindly invited KKM to visit another town called Kapitigolawale in North Central Province comprising displaced Sinhala families resettled there after ethnic unrest. It borders a Tamil community that was also displaced. In 2018, in a project aptly named 'A Taste of Peace', KKM staff and well-wishers joined families there to cook and enjoy each other's traditional dishes. In 2019, vanloads of Tamil and Sinhala families affected by leprosy from Jaffna, Bohagasveva and Kilinochchi gathered in Mullaitivu to play games, share lunch, partake in workshops and enact dramas. Divided into mixed groups, they were able to get by with a handful of words in common, some sign language and lots of laughter. It was heartening to see goodwill gestures from both ethnic groups snowballing into so many delightful encounters. In 2017, KKM started an organization called the Leprosy Association to empower persons affected by leprosy to work together to dispel myths about leprosy and eradicate the disease from Sri Lanka. Among their activities, they have assisted Muslim families affected by leprosy with sustainable housing. Earlier this year, following the bombing of churches on Easter Sunday that led to a backlash against Muslim communities, KKM and Leprosy Association members visited leprosy-affected Muslim families in Eastern Province to offer protection and promote goodwill. Many friendships continue to be forged as a result of encounters between different ethnic and faith communities affected by leprosy. In this way, KKM hopes that mutual respect, tolerance and acceptance will increase and lead to a united Sri Lanka.
